# Workshop on Measuring Successful Return to Work February 9 & 10, 2017



### **Keynote Speaker**

Ellen MacEachen, University of Waterloo

Ellen MacEachen is an Associate Professor in the School of Public Health & Health Systems at the University of Waterloo. She is also codirector of the Centre for Research on Work Disability Policy. Her research examines the

design and performance of work and health systems to identify how they can be adapted to changing economic and social environments of our global economy. In particular, she considers ways that workers fall through the cracks of systems designed to support them and how these can be improved. On all of her studies, she works closely with policy-makers and community stakeholders.

# **Keynote Abstract**

How do we measure return to work, how should we measure it, and why does it matter? This presentation reviews current approaches in the scientific literature to defining and measuring the return to employment after work injury and offers a critique of what is measured, and how and when. Qualitative research studies help us to get 'behind' the numbers to point out important facets of return to work that should be considered when evaluating return-to-work policies and programs. The implications and politics of measurement will be discussed.


