Consultant, Scholar and Innovations Fellow at the Metcalf Foundation

John Stapleton has had a lengthy and well respected career in public service. For 28 years, he worked for the Ontario government during which time he was the senior policy advisor

to the Social Assistance Review Committee and the Minister's Advisory Group on New Legislation. He was also the Research Director for the Task Force on Modernizing Income Security for Working-Age Adults in Toronto. Stapleton teaches a popular course on public policy for community advocates, at Open Policy Ontario, and serves on the Board of Directors of the Daily Bread Food Bank.

Keynote Abstract

In this presentation John Stapleton examines all forms of disability income sources in Canada (including workers' compensation). He points out that social assistance disability income expenditures are not only growing faster but growing in their share of overall disability expenditures. This is the case in Ontario and several other provinces. Stapleton explores reasons why this growth is occurring.
